# Report to Staff and Parents following Board of Management Meeting 27<sup>th</sup> April 2023

# **Teaching and Learning**

The current Teaching and Learning group are working on a plan for next year which will focus on whole school initiatives to improve students study and study skills.

# **P-PADE**

At a recent staff meeting staff were given a presentation on this new assessment developed by NEPS which can help with RACE, Irish Exemptions, the continuum of support and DARE. This assessment will be administered to all first years next year as well as the NGRT and CAT tests. It will produce reports for the SET team as well as a report for subject teachers. The main SET team have been trained on the administration of the test.

# **Learner Voice**

At a recent staff meeting the learner voice team showed a video of three students explaining how having dyslexia affects their learning and what helps them to learn better. This is to encourage students to express themselves, to give them a voice around teaching and learning and to educate teachers on students difficulties.

# **DES Subject inspection**

We have been informed that there will be a History inspection next week.

# **DEIS** Plan

It was noted that at the end of each year an analysis of how we are doing with the DEIS targets is conducted. The results of the review of the targets at the end of 2021-22 was presented to staff and show some targets met and some with more work to do. At the staff meeting staff were reminded of the interventions at class, subject department and whole school level.

# **School planning**

Senior Management prepared a list of school policies that require reviewing and developing. This review process is ongoing. The list was presented to staff and work has begun on the following:

• Code of Behaviour – A group of staff has begun reviewing this policy and started the consultation process with staff.

- The Guidance team are currently developing a new three year policy on Guidance to take account of the new guidelines from the NCGE. Helen and the guidance teachers have attended two days of inservice on this, a guidance team has been set up and an initial meeting with staff has taken place.
- The Health and Safety Co-ordinator has worked with staff to conduct risk assessments and the Health and Safety policy has been sent to the ETB.
- A group has been set up to develop a new SPHE and RSE policy in line with the changes to the syllabus in both.

# Year Planner 23-24

Staff have agreed on the structure of the year planner for 23-24 including Croke Park hours, CBA schedule and assessment schedule. The BOM approved the plan for the year.

# **Posts of Responsibility**

The Board approved the updated list of posts of responsibility following the recent appointment of three new APII posts.

#### **Transfer Applications**

It was noted that we will be accepting applications for transfer from the 1<sup>st</sup> May to the 31<sup>st</sup> May. After that we will hold another Board of Management meeting to see how many places are available and to conduct any lottery if necessary.

#### **Induction Morning for incoming first years**

It was noted that the school held an induction morning for incoming first years on Saturday  $25^{\text{th}}$  March.

# Feedback from first year parents

A questionnaire was send to first year parents to get feedback on how their children are getting on in the school and their thoughts on the school. In addition they were given questions on the use of the Lenovo device. The Board was presented with a copy of the feedback. The feedback was very positive with the vast majority of parents saying they were happy with the use of the Lenovo device. The overriding concerns were around parents

parking, shortage of space and disruption due to construction. The other matter that came up frequently was the weight of the school bags.

#### **Buildings**

The Board was updated on the ongoing building and maintenance works as follows:

- We have been informed that there will be a delay of three weeks in the handover of phase 1 of the building. We are currently looking at how this will impact us for September and whether we will need to rent additional rooms in the town to tide us over or look again at when transition years do their work experience.
- The architects have provided draft plans for phase 2 of the building.
- We have recovered the floor of the two Engineering rooms and are planning on doing the same for the woodwork rooms.
- We are currently working with the procurement section of the ETB to go through the tendering process for all the equipment needed in the new building.
