


- Students will get one subject on each band depending on their choices



Junior Cycle Subjects

In the Junior Cycle, students will study a combination of Full Subjects and Short Courses. Of the Full Subjects, English, Irish, Maths and History are compulsory while all the others are optional i.e. students will choose the remaining subjects during their school's subject choice process. For students who may struggle at this level, an additional range of subjects known as Learning Programmes has been designed, three at Level 2 and three at Level 1.

Short Courses are typically half the size of full subjects and do not have a terminal exam. Short Courses offered can vary between schools. **Wellbeing** is central to the Junior Cycle, meaning that subjects such as SPHE, CSPE and PE are also compulsory.

Practical

These subjects are 'hands-on' and involve working with tools and machinery on physical things like wood, metals and plastic. They may involve designing, planning and building things.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Materials Technology Wood (MTW) is one of the technology subjects offered at Junior Cycle. In MTW you will learn to design small projects and the skills required to use tools and equipment to make your designs. You will work mainly with wood but also with other materials. You will learn about wood as a material and how it is produced.


In Junior Cycle Wood Technology students learn woodworking skills, use design thinking and finally create projects as well as learning about sustainability and the importance of trees to the world around us.

3. Keep your options open for the future

When you are coming into First Year you are not expected to know what you want to do after Leaving Cert!

But it is helpful to keep your options open as much as possible.

Choosing a language will help ensure this.

Be aware- there are subjects you will need for entry to specific courses after Leaving Cert.

We do not produce enough language graduates!!

Language requirements for after school options:

If you have an exemption from the study of Irish on the basis of a learning difficulty you are likely to be eligible for exemption from the language requirements for college.

Some colleges may look for evidence of a disability, for example through an Educational Psychologists report

Third Language Requirement

Some third level colleges require students have a **third language** to gain entry - English & Irish are the first two. (Not applicable to students with a language exemption)

NUI's – UCC, UCD, Maynooth and University of Galway, RCSI, Shannon College of Hotel Management require a 3rd language for entry into many of their courses.

Other colleges do not, however if a language is part of your chosen degree, that language will be a requirement to gain entry to that course.

For Example:

University of Limerick does not require a third language, however, if you choose to study French and Law you must have taken French for your Leaving Cert.

Colleges that do NOT require a Third Language for Entry

University of Limerick (UL), Trinity College Dublin (TCD), Will accept English & another language.



The exceptions to the rule!

A third language is **not required** for most courses in **Engineering, Science or Nursing** programmes.






What happens next?
